1. Approval of January Minutes

- Michael Stout moves to approve January minutes

- Judge Goldbaum seconds, but with proposed amendment to change the language on page 3
 - Minutes approved with amendment at 12:08 pm

2. Chelo Guerrero, Health & Human Services

- *Approve and Sign Letter of Support, Dona Ana County Local DWI Program, FY23 Annual Grant Application*
 - Applies annually for distribution funds from the state and additional grant money. They are asked to submit letters of support with those requests, and they are now asking the council to approve a letter for this.
 - Judge Goldbaum: really encourages the CJCC to sign off on this letter and strongly supports everything that the grant provides. Treatment courts make a huge difference in our community.
 - Judge Arrieta thinks we should support this, but there are a few changes he would like to see, namely to separate their roles as judges from their roles in CJCC.
 1. Judge Arrieta motions to have the committee provide a letter of support to Chelo Guerrero with minor changes
 2. Lieutenant Peter Bradley seconds this motion
 3. Motion passed and approved as amended at 12:14 pm
- *Review General Components Inventory Survey – in preparation for Sequential Intercept Mapping workshop*
 - Awarded a technical assistance grant for creating their own Sequential Intercept Model and there will be a workshop that all of CJCC will be invited to.
 - Needs some volunteers to gather some of the missing data and would like to have this done by next week.
 1. Judge Arrieta: asked Jaime Michael to send the questionnaire to him and he'll have someone work on it.
 2. Jamie Michael: asks Lieutenant Bradley with LCPD if he would help her with the law enforcement information
 - a. Lieutenant Peter Bradley will get her the information as soon as he can.

3. Captain Jesse Williams, New Mexico State Police

- *Improving the PTI Process*
 - Would like to get some ideas about how to improve the pretrial interview process, specifically DWIs. They are having an issue scheduling PTIs and see a lot of dismissal of these cases because of technicalities and it's frustrating for the officers.
 - *Judge Cano*: a large portion of cases filed by officers are being dismissed without the possibility of ever being refiled.
 - *Judge Arrieta*: the courts are always open to holding discussions about issues like this to educate the public. This might be one way for the officers to understand when and where they're supposed to be involved. Judge Arrieta thinks this is a real concerns that needs to be addressed.
 - *Michael Stout*: The issue is reflective of broad discovery issues. It's more of an administrative issue in terms of getting people where they need to be. It is up to prosecuting authorities to make sure certain people are available.

- *Gerald Byers*: the defense is entitled to all of the discovery. They will work towards securing that discovery from law enforcement partners and provide it to the defense in a timely manner. It has become more and more difficult to coordinate timeframes and provide discovery, and his office is concerned.
- *Interim NMSU Deputy Chief Dunivan*: shares the same frustration as Captain Williams. His agency is not receiving appropriate communications in a timely manner.
- *Gerald Byers*: If we are committed to working together to mutually resolve these issues with professionalism and respect then we can make some headway. The DA's office is ready to participate.
